Solving Dinosaur Mysteries!

Bringing the Museum to You [AGES: 6-9]

DAY ONE

Explore the REAL world of dinosaurs with Betsy Carlson from the Burpee Museum of Natural History! You have seen movies portraying dinosaurs as able to speculate and think. Would that have been possible? Would you have been able to tame a dinosaur? Is it really true that the brain of a Stegosaurus was the size of a walnut? Did some dinosaurs have more than one brain? Find out how paleontologists study dinosaur brains and explore these ideas as we examine them up close. Do you remember the dinosaurs in Jurassic World looking perky with their hands held like a rabbit? Could they really maneuver them so carefully? How did they use their forelimbs, especially Tyrannosaurus rex with his little limbs? The Burpee Museum has a Stegosaurus ulna collected in 2018. You will look at the ulnas of dinosaurs and compare them to ulnas of modern animals.

Today we will study tails and teeth! Tails have fascinated paleontologists throughout history. Originally they had Tyrannosaurus rex balancing on his tail. At times the tails were thought to be a means of defense. Over time researchers have made new discoveries as to the use of the tail. We will look at an ox tail and compare the similarities. Learn about these discoveries and experiment with the theories. This afternoon we will move on to Theropod teeth! Examine teeth of living carnivores and compare them to modern herbivores. Examine fossil dinosaur teeth. Learn about bite force behind these fearsome saber-like teeth. Prepare a Tyrannosaurus rex tooth cast to take home. Before the end of this camp, you will put your knowledge to the test and participate in a simulated dig for bones using the same methods used by paleontologists!

During camp students will have the unique opportunity to handle and examine both casts and real artifacts from the museum! Students will be supervised during lunch and should bring a sack lunch that does not require refrigeration. [1 week-2 sessions]

We will start our morning with an outing at Millennium Park where you will see Pritzker Pavilion designed by architect Frank Gehry, which is home to many of Chicago's outdoor concerts and events. View the magnificent Cloud Gate sculpture (often referred to as "the Bean"). The 110-ton elliptical sculpture reflects Chicago's famous skyline and the clouds above for a unique photo opportunity. Explore this architectural marvel up close. We will also experience the landmark Crown Fountain consisting of two 50-foot glass block towers at each end of a shallow reflecting pool. The towers project faces of Chicago citizens, with the illusion of water spouting from their mouths. Hop back on the bus and take a driving tour to see famous landmarks including Soldier Field, the lions standing guard at the Art Institute and more. We will make a stop at Navy Pier for lunch and a ride on the Centennial Wheel; an iconic part of the Chicago skyline and a treasured piece of Chicago cultural history. Soaring to heights of nearly 200 feet, the wheel offers unparalleled, 360-degree views of Chicago and Lake Michigan. Afterwards, enjoy lunch on your own at any of Navy Pier's eateries including Bubba Gump Shrimp, Harry Caray's or any of the many restaurants located here. This afternoon we will head to the Museum of Science and Industry. Since opening in 1933, the Museum of Science and Industry has been dedicated to inspiring the inventive genius in everyone with uniquely interactive experiences. Visit the Genetics and Baby Chick Hatchery, take a trip underground to the Coal Mine, watch the trains wind through the Great Train Story; experience the laca ractory and Toymaker 3000. We have also included admission to the on-board tour of the U-505 Submarine. Board the actual craft that stalked the waters of the Atlantic before it was blown to the surface and captured on June 4, 1944. From the cramped quarters to the feel of battle, it's an interactive walk through a piece of history that you'll never forget!
