Dear Peru Bright Futures Preschool Parents/Guardians,

You are receiving this letter because you have expressed an interest in the Peru Elementary School District 124 Bright Futures Preschool Program that is held at Northview School. This letter will give you a lot of great information when making your decision if you want to send your child to the Bright Futures program.

Peru Elementary School District 124 was awarded the Preschool for All Grant beginning with the 2026-27 school year. We also received the Preschool for All Expansion Grant, which allows us to run a full day preschool for our most at-risk PreK students. Our grant includes serving up to 10 total students per year from our neighbors in Dimmick and Dalzell for the half day program. Securing this grant also means that there will be NO tuition charges or fees for preschool.

We will be registering all of our current students who will still be PreK age next school year first. Then we will enroll students not in our program in this order: 1) The child must be screened by our Preschool team and paperwork is filled out by the parent; 2) children that will turn four years old by September 1, 2026 will have first preference on enrollment after they have been screened 3) three year old children that have been screened by our PreK team and there are some "at-risk" indicators such as speech/language delays, readiness delays, behavior concerns and points are awarded based on the weighted eligibility criteria.

Students who do not meet #1-3 above will be put on a waiting list until after the final August PreK screening to assure that we do enroll all of the 4-year-olds first and then the most "at risk" 3-year olds.

The preschool student hours are as follows: a.m. session will run from 7:45-10:15 a.m. and the p.m. session will run from 11:15 a.m. – 1:45 p.m. The full day session runs from 7:45 a.m. -1:45 p.m. and offers a hot breakfast and a hot lunch, along with an afternoon snack.

When considering your options for Preschool for the coming year, I want to inform you of what the Bright Futures Preschool Program has to offer:

- Three highly qualified teachers who have their Bachelor's Degree and/or Master's Degree in Child Development. Mrs. Chasteen, Mrs. Dellinger and Ms. Fahler are our two half-day Preschool Teachers. Ms. Preston teaches our full day PreK program.
- Free pick up bus transportation for a.m. session, Free drop off bus transportation for p.m. session, and free bus transportation for full day session both pick up and drop off from school (even sitters who reside in the district) IF you live in the bus zone.
- The children will attend school Monday through Friday.

- Our program uses the Early Learning and Development Standards to build lesson plans designed with incremental learning. Our program uses the curriculum called *Creative Curriculum/Teaching Strategies*. Teachers implement a curriculum which focuses on child involvement and hands-on experiences. A focus is a phonemic awareness program where children learn to segment words and hear sounds in words which will make them more successful in reading and spelling.
- State of the art technology, which includes interactive whiteboards and iPads. Interactive whiteboards allow teachers to actively engage students with an interactive screen. Technology is limited for our students as we try to only allow 30 minutes of screen time per week.
- All preschool students are included in all of our school incentives throughout the year. There are incentives and assemblies for our PBIS program (Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports).
- The preschool teacher exposes the students to positive experiences essential to helping children develop intellectually, socially, emotionally, and physically.
- Preschool children are able to experience checking out books from our school library at Northview. Adults read to children every day. Language and literacy skills are developed through meaningful participation in dramatic play; communicating informally; and experimenting with writing, drawing, copying and inventive spelling.
- Fine and gross motor skills are developed through play activities. Fine-motor skill activities include pegboards, stringing beads, construction sets, puzzles, drawing, painting and cutting. Gross-motor skill activities include balancing, running and jumping. Children have opportunities throughout the day to move freely, using large muscles within indoor and outdoor activity areas.
- Self-confidence and positive learning experiences are built by encouraging children to accomplish meaningful tasks and to help them participate in learning successful experiences.
